COOPERATIVE PRINCIPLES

In February 1970, a small group of people gathered, elected nine directors, hired an attorney and an experienced engineer and purchased both Ely Light and Power Co. and Eureka Light. Grown from the community, Mt. Wheeler Power is dedicated to seven fundamental cooperative principles.

VOLUNTARY AND OPEN MEMBERSHIP

1

Cooperatives are voluntary organizations, open to all persons able to use their services and willing to accept the responsibilities of membership.

DEMOCRATIC MEMBER CONTROL

Cooperatives are democratic organizations controlled by their members, who actively participate in setting policies and making decisions.

MEMBER'S ECONOMIC PARTICIPATION

3

Members contribute equitably to and democratically control the capital of their cooperative.


